


Fathers Reading Every Day.....And Granddads Too!

2012 Fort Bend County Fathers Reading Every Day - Research shows that reading aloud to children on a frequent basis promotes early literacy among young children, and that strong relationships exist between children 's literacy skills, academic performance, and future income potential. AgriLife Extension and FB ISD Title I Schools initiated a program to encourage families (particularly dads) to become more involved in their students educational process - Fathers Reading Every Day (FRED). More than 260 parents & children completed some aspect of FRED, with 86 parents &



children completing the entire program. Parents read an average of 31 books with their children, and averaged more than 490 minutes of reading time together during the four-week program. Results indicate more time is spent reading, improved vocabulary, higher grads and improved relationships.



Keys to the Courthouse.....A Lesson in Government!

Educating youth about the role of county government in the daily lives of Texans prepares them to become knowledgeable constituents. In an effort to assist youth in social studies, the "Keys to the Courthouse" curriculum was introduced to local schools in the spring of 2012. The program featured 5 lessons that contain age-appropriate (7th and 12th grade) classroom and research activities. Two Fort Bend ISD teachers were trained to facilitate and present the "Keys to the Courthouse" curriculum to 141 students. Results indicated that 83% could make better leadership decisions, 77% have a better appreciation for government, 58% wish to become involved in government, and 65% can now help to educate other youth.
