Visitors and new members are always welcome (membership dues are \$10.00 per person for the calendar year). We will be called to order at 7:30 after 30 minutes of social time.



January Meeting Notes

President Danessa Yaschuk opened the meeting and greeted everyone. Vice President Joseph "Jody" Taylor had the following announcements:

- Whip-a-Stitch Embroidery is selling hats with the official FBBA logo. FBBA receives a \$5 donation from every hat purchased. See Barbara if you are interested in buying a hat.
- Central Texas Beekeepers Association's 14th Annual Beekeeping School is on March 2nd in Brenham. This is one of the best one-day schools and we are fortunate for it to be so close to home. Registration is already open. The website is CentralTexasBeekeepers.org
- On Saturday (1/13/24), join us at Cinemark Rosenberg 12 for the 6:55 pm showing of *The Beekeeper*, starring Jason Statham. Wearing your beekeeper suit or jacket isn't mandatory but highly encouraged. We will do a group photo with those 'properly attired'. (You still have time to wash it!) This is an action movie rated R. As of yesterday, there were plenty of good seats still available, but we recommend getting your tickets online in advance.

- For those of you just starting in beekeeping, our Intro to Beekeeping group will meet prior to the regular meeting February thru May, from 6:00-7:00 pm. There will also be one, possibly two meet-ups at a nearby apiary for a little hands-on. Additionally, we have a private Facebook group where you can ask questions and post photos. If you are interested in joining the group, please sign the Intro to Beekeeping sheet being passed around and details and a registration form will be emailed to you.

Gene DeBons gave us a very interesting History Moment, about the introduction of African bees to Brazil. Most of us know the story of how a beekeeper unintentionally removed queen excluders from the hives, which allowed the 26 African colonies to swarm. However, it seems likely this story was either a convenient myth or only a part of how the African bees became established in Brazil. An article in December's *American Bee Journal* takes a close look at the information available from published accounts. The importation of the bees to Brazil by Dr. Warwick Kerr, is well-documented. He shipped 142 queens, but some died in transit, some weren't accepted or were superseded by the bee colonies, and some were eliminated from the program for their excessive aggressiveness, leaving 40 queens, of which 26 were determined to be the "most productive and hardworking"... Their only "serious defect" being "its great aggression." It was firmly believed the aggression would be eliminated by crossbreeding with the Italian bees already established in Brazil. Because of this, the evidence suggests, it is likely that queen excluders were never used. In 1991, an interviewer asked Dr. Kerr,

“If he could live his life over again, would he do anything differently?” Dr. Kerr replied, “I would leave those African bees where I found them.”

Lynne Jones gave a presentation on some of the hive types available, their advantages and disadvantages, and the basic equipment needed to get started in beekeeping. The two most popular hive types are the Top Bar and the Langstroth (standard set-up, Horizontal, all Mediums, and hives made from insulated/manufactured materials). For protective gear, a jacket or full suit in triple-layer ventilated material is highly recommended. There are many options for gloves ranging from thin nitrile gloves to thick, PVC-coated gloves. Depending on the attitude of your bees on any given day, you may need a variety. You will definitely need a smoker and at least two hive tools. A bee brush, frame grip and frame holder are things you might use, but not necessities. Regardless of whether you are starting with a Nuc or a package, you will need to feed your bees. There are a variety of feeders, but an internal feeder is the best option because it is less likely to set off a robbing frenzy. Treasurer's Report

Treasurer's Report as of January 28, 2024.

Our reported treasury balance on December 31, 2023 was \$785.16. Since this report we received \$260.00 in payments (\$250.00 dues, \$5.00 donation from hat purchases & \$5.00 member donation). We re-credited \$100 to our account for a check never cashed. The only expense was \$15.59 for the monthly Squarespace fee. (The monthly fee increased from 12.99.) The resulting balance is \$1,129.57 (\$1079.57 in the checking account, plus \$50.00 in cash to make change.)
